

NOTICE



FIREARMS PROHIBITED

It is unlawful for any person (i) to knowingly carry on or about his person any firearm as defined in § 18.2-308.2:2 and (ii) to knowingly do so within 100 feet of any building, or part thereof, used for any of the following purposes:

- A meeting place for the local electoral board §§ 24.2-107, 24.2-653.01, 24.2-671.
- The principal office of the general registrar used for voter registration and/or in-person absentee voting §§ 24.2-411, 24.2-701.1.
- An additional voter registration and/or in-person absentee voting site §§ 24.2-413, 24.2-701.1.
- Drop-off locations for return of absentee ballots § 24.2-707.1
- A place used as a central absentee precinct § 24.2-712.
- A polling place § 24.2-604.
- A meeting place for the State Board of Elections to ascertain results of an election § 24.2-679.
- A place used for an election recount § 24.2-802.1.

Exceptions: a) a law-enforcement officer or a retired law-enforcement officer qualified pursuant to subsection C of § 18.2-308.016; b) any person occupying his own private property that falls within 100 feet of the building used for any of the purposes above; or c) an armed security officer, licensed pursuant to Article 4 (§ 9.1-138 et seq.) of Chapter 1 of Title 9.1, whose employment or performance of his duties occurs within 100 feet of any building, or part thereof, used for any of these purposes.

Violation is a Class 1 misdemeanor, punishable by up to 12 months in jail and a fine of up to \$2500, either or both.
